Good Evening. My name is Kevin Kent. I live at 3662 Eagle Harbor Road in the Town of Albion.

The proposed Helena Chemical relocation site on Long Bridge Road is productive farmland that is not zoned for commercial activity.

There are alternative sites that may be far more suitable. At least four of these are in the Town of Albion at the industrial park on Butts Road, the Helix building on West Avenue, as well as sites at the intersections of both Densmore and Transit Roads and the railroad. None of these are productive farmland.

Even more suitable sites exist on the northeast corner of Transit Road and the railroad and at the northwest corner of Allis Road and the railroad. It is not clear that Helena has investigated these and other sites, some of which are owned by farmers likely to use services similar to Helena's.

None of the sites just mentioned are currently in agricultural production. One of them (on Allis Road) has been dedicated to the type of activity Helena proposes for its new location. Other sites exist in the Town of Murray but may not work as well for the company.

A town board exists to represent the interests of town residents. Appproving Helena's relocation to Long Bridge Road is not, in my opinion, in the interests of Albion residents

To all elected officials on the Albion Town Board,

This is a letter to voice my concern about the proposed zoning change to the 17.596-acre portion of tax parcel ID# 82-01-02 on Long Bridge Road in Albion. First, I want to make it clear that I am not against the growth of Helena Chemical Company. What I AM against is the way the Albion Town Board appears to be trying to "rubber stamp" zoning change. To quote code-enforcement officer Dan Strong when he spoke regarding the zoning on the aforementioned property, "This is just a process."

No, this isn't "just a process." This is what we taxpayers pay you to do. It's your job to hold discussions and meet with the residents, business owners, and commuters the zoning change will affect. No one stopped at my house to talk to me or my family about the proposed zoning change.

It sets a negative precedence to "spot zone" parcels of land whenever it suits the Town Board's needs. If you give a variance for this parcel, what will stop you from giving it to the next business that wants to operate on another back road in Albion?

Also, did the Board thoroughly review ALL aspects of this project before it decided to hold this vote? Many questions will arise: Is Long Bridge Road wide enough and sturdy enough to withstand the heavy commercial traffic that would now travel on it? Will railroad crossing lights be put up for increased safety? What about fire service? This location is the farthest from any fire department that it can get. Did the board research all the environmental effects? Did we consult with the Department of Environmental Conservation? All of these aspects must be reviewed before zoning change should take effect, not only to protect the residents of Albion, but also to protect Helena Chemical Company from buying a parcel of land it cannot use.

Perhaps a different location would be best for Helena's expansion. How about the business park on Butts Road? The Town Board should have thought about that parcel. The zoning is correct. There would be fewer homes affected. The fire service is close by, as is the same railroad line that runs across Long Bridge Road. The road is built for commercial traffic, and the location is closer to canal bridges that have the appropriate weight limits to move the heavy cargo.

Finally, did anyone review the business plan for the proposed facility? What will they sell? What services will they offer? Why are they building so far from town? This same board that was against Wal-Mart being out of the village is now thinking nothing of allowing Helena Chemical to build on Long Bridge Road.

In closing, I want to be on the record that I am against the zoning change. There must be a more appropriate place to put Helena's facility in the town of Albion, one that is beneficial to Helena Chemical and Albion's families.

Supervisor Koehler and Members of the Albion Town Board,

Much of the discussion re Helena's proposed move has focused on the potential for environmental contamination. Though I consider myself an environmentalist, that is not my primary concern. Before making my main arguments, I will say that some of them relate to the environment. Those who live closer to the site have every right to feel differently, but there are people who live within a block of the current Helena location and don't even know it is there. I will say two things. If there is no reason to be concerned about chemical contamination of any kind, why not locate the new facility at the industrial site at the corner of Butts Road and East Avenue? Secondly, a location close to fire service makes more sense to me than putting it about as far from fire service as one possibly could while still being in the center of the County.

More importantly, I object to the proposed relocation based on considerations having to do with orderly development, the Comprehensive Plan, the future of Albion and Orleans County, keeping faith with Town residents, adherence to existing zoning, the preservation of greenspace and agricultural land, and common sense.

This proposal differs little from locating Wal-Mart on 24 acres of vacant land. If anything, allowing Wal-Mart to dictate their location to the town made more sense because it was at least adjacent to a commercial area. Locating Helena on Long Bridge Road helps eliminate another part of the town from consideration by future homeowners.

It also eliminates 17 more acres from agricultural use, something Farm Bureau ordinarily has a major problem with.

One of the reasons Albion appeals to new residents--who also build the tax base--is its abundance of greenspace. Greenspace is lost incrementally. At some point an area becomes just another hodge-podge of activity with no consistency and decreased appeal. Instead of having one area set aside for commercial and light industrial activity, and another designated agricultural-residential, you throw them together. The result is a premature loss of the town's rural character--the very thing which makes it appealing to the people who come here from Paterson, New Jersey, Minneapolis, Clarence, Rochester and even Penfield and elsewhere. This may be tolerable short term, but it is ruinous to the town's long term prospects and viability.

In Helena's application, someone checked the "no" box when asked whether their facility would visually conflict with what one sees at the site presently. A small point, one may think, but a preposterous answer to a question that was asked for a reason. On another question, "no" was checked regarding whether what they proposed would have any implications for "threatened" species. Did the person checking the "no" box have any idea what avian, amphibian, reptilian, or other species might be at issue? I know for a fact that at least one reptile found west of Allen's Bridge Road is called a "species of concern" by The Nature Conservancy. Savannah, vesper and grasshopper sparrows are all in serious decline in New York State, though they nest

in Albion. They are not "threatened" officially like Henslow's sparrow which could adapt to habitat similar to that at the proposed site and could already be in this area. Of the eight endangered, or threatened, avian species that may be found in Orleans County, the one most likely to forage Long Bridge Road is the northern harrier or marsh hawk. It is seen on Allen's Bridge Road.

As I indicated earlier, though, my primary concern is not environmental in the usual sense.

My good friend, Joe Gehl, suggested in his remarks to you that changing Albion's zoning to accommodate erratic development undermines the relationship between residents and their elected leaders. To me, it breaks faith with residents who decided to live where they do knowing certain things. They paid what they paid because certain things were "given." They paid more to be surrounded by a rural vista, agricultural activity, minimal traffic, an occasional train. They knew there was no water at first. Ag-residential zoning and being five miles from the nearest village gave them some assurance. Distance and an absence of municipal water meant fire protection would be minimal to non-existent. All these things were parts of the calculation that went into an investment decision. That is what they counted on and paid for. Changing the zoning to permit a chemical facility meant they had, in effect, been betrayed and all bets were off on the biggest investment they might ever make. If it is allowed to be done to these people--most of whom I did not know in January--it can be done to any operson in the town--to any person who decides to move here. To me, it is morally unacceptable when sites zoned for the purpose exist elsewhere in the town.

When I first asked about the industrial park near St. Gobain, it sounded as if it hadn't been pursued. The next thing I heard was it would cost too much to put in a rail spur. On April 2, I heard yet another answer. The lead spokesman for Helena said it would not work because too many people live nearby and it would be a public relations nightmare. It boils down to doing what is in the company's interest rather than what is best for the town just as it did with Wal-Mart. If there is no serious contamination hazard, why doesn't it make sense to locate it where a rapid response by fire fighters would be possible?

In my view permitting Helena's proposed relocation site is not in the best interests of the residents and long term development in the Town of Albion. It would continue to promote the perception that Albion is "easy." Too often things apparently as innocuous as taping yard sale fliers at the intersection of State and Main have been done with impunity in Albion. Don't try doing it in Medina. There is no doubt an upside to prisons, landfills, Wal-Marts and chemical facilities. Certainly the latter "comes with the territory." But there is a downside because all of these come at a cost, especially when they are not located where they best serve residents. As an example, how much better off might the Village of Albion have been if Wal-Mart had been induced/required to locate within the village without a grocery operation? Would you say our still attractive town with all that it has going for it was made more, or less, attractive when the

landfill was shut down? What was that fight really about?

My view is that this is a major decision point for the future of Albion. Our central location makes us an attractive site for almost everything commercial. Saying "No!" to the Long Bridge Road site should do a lot for our future prospects as well as our self-respect.

Some years back (I believe it was in the mid-90's) I was one of the many volunteers who worked on developing a "Comprehensive Plan" for the local community - a joint effort involving the Towns of Albion and Barre and the Village of Albion. This "Task Force" existed because its members had a sincere interest in the good of their neighborhood. Stu Brown Associates - a Rochester-based consulting firm - provided the 'professional' requirements.

One of the purposes of this extensive study was to identify particular areas within the towns involved which were best-suited for specific types of activity because, without a plan, anyone was free to build or operate virtually anything - anywhere.

After many, many volunteer hours of work and some \$ 60,000 in professional fees each of the municipalities adopted the Plan as their modus operandi for future development.

Since the adoption, I haven't heard of any of the 'partners' opting out of this arrangement.

When Wal-Mart chose Albion for a store location the Plan locations for retail businesses (along Route 98 to the South of the village and along Route 31 to the East of the village) were ignored and the Town allowed them to locate where THEY (Wal-Mart) wanted - a residential-agricultural location, necessitating a zoning change.

Now we have another scenario whereby a business wants to set up in a similarly-zoned (residential-agricultural) location. Alternative spots are available to meet the company's needs without re-zoning.

In my mind, and I believe I can speak for most of the people who worked on the creation of the Comprehensive Plan, a community must have some foresight in its development and it must stick to its plan. Without some sort of structure, or order, there's chaos and confusion. By continuing to allow businesses to dictate their desires - over the rights of the neighbors - threatens everyone who owns property within the town. No "plan" is sacred! - - - who wants to live in such an environment?

Many years ago the Albion Village Board allowed Liptons to enlarge one of their buildings by closing off Clinton Street. Liptons is long-gone, but the village residents are STILL inconvenienced if they want to travel the length of Clinton Street.

Although I'm no longer a resident of Albion, my allegiance to the community still remains with you. In addition to the questionable legality and morality of this issue I feel personally insulted that my involvement for the common good may be ignored to benefit some business which may choose to leave because the bottom-line isn't satisfied.

In a democratic society a government should exist to serve those who elected them - not use them to meet corporate needs.

For the benefit of all your constituents, and to maintain your own self-esteem, I encourage you to deny the requested variance.

Might Chatfield have reached a different conclusion about the absence of an "overall significant impact on the environment" had the questions on Part 1 of the EAF been answered more forthrightly?

Supervisor Koehler and Members of the Town Board:

Comments regarding Helena's Environmental Assessment Form (EAF)

The answers provided to questions on page 5 of the EAF suggest the potential for the proposed project to dwarf that of the existing location. The applicant describes it as involving 600 feet of road frontage (three building lots) and the ultimate development of 15 acres of a 17.6 acre site.

This and the fact that soybean seed is stacked four pallets high in standard size tote boxes in the current building suggests any new warehouse could be both expansive and visually obtrusive due to its height.

The applicant's answers to questions on page 9 appear almost disingenuous in light of current zoning, The Comprehensive Plan and the surrounding immediate area.

With regard to traffic not exceeding present levels. Helena has said their business is highly seasonal. It would follow that traffic would dramatically increase during their peak season. The only way it could be portrayed differently is if it were averaged over the entire year.

In Part 2--'Project (environmental) Impacts and their Magnitude', the words "Responsibility of Lead Agency" (which is the Town of Albion) appear. This part was apparently completed by Jason Foote.

Questions on pages 14-17 in part 2 have to do with the proposed action's impact on water quality, loss of farmland (green space), effect on animal life and aesthetics. (There are, for example, threatened and endangered species is this area.) The only question (of five) answered with complete candor related to impact on agricultural land resources. To me, someone more familiar with the immediate area and its resources could not candidly answer "No" to 4 of the 5 questions.

With respect to page 19, question 19, to guide the applicant the form provides specific examples to help answer, "Will the proposed action affect the character of the existing community?" The third example given says, "Proposed action will conflict with officially adopted plans or goals." The proposed action clearly appears to conflict with The Comprehensive Plan.

If Mr. Foote answered questions on Part 2 without adequate knowledge and has to take Helena representative Martin Wilbur's answers at face value, he might conclude the proposed action would have no significant environmental impact. Looking at the applicant's answers critically would suggest a different conclusion.

I reiterate that I am not against Helena relocating in our area. Few people around here seem to be, but I am opposed to allowing it to relocate at the proposed site.

Mrs. Supervisor, and Council Members;

I would like to say thank you for taking the time tonight to listen to our concerns in regard to the zoning change on Long Bridge and also our concerns with Helena Chemical relocating across the street from our home.

The use of zoning is what protects our rights as property owners. The main definition includes the words "to allocate certain kinds of structures in certain areas; zoning also includes restrictions in different zoning areas". Zoning is what home buyers inquire about when buying their homes. We looked for a house outside the hub bub of the Village; we wanted a quiet area with neighbors around us but not so close as to be on top of one another. What we found was our property on Long Bridge in the Town of Albion. It was perfect; the houses are sprinkled out around farmland, and the zoning is Agricultural/Residential, which was the main reason we decided to invest in our current location.

Farmland to the west of us and to the south of us alternates between corn and soy beans, and, according to the zoning plan, we could look forward to that continuing or maybe acquire a new neighbor or two. That was what fits in the agricultural-residential definition, not a commercial business. That was an unspoken, reasonable expectation we had when making the biggest investment of our lives.

Currently Helena Chemical does not pose too big a threat to a populated area they are in. They sell and distribute seeds, farming supplies, and chemicals. They do not mix or blend chemicals now. They want to expand their business and as their bottom line grows they hope to expand even further, getting into mixing chemicals and producing fertilizer. If they move onto Long Bridge and as their business expands the hidden threats do as well. There is the fear of a chemical spill and the possibility of a fire which would take as least 10-12 minutes for Medina or 12-15 minutes for Albion to respond to, seeings as we are the furthest point of town. They claim to want to build a spur into the railroad to increase business along the rail. So they need two things: A Railroad Overlay, and a zoning modification that would make 17.5 acres of land agri/business. When we asked Mitch, the general manager, if they planned on using the railroad right away, he said no that it was a part of their expansion plan only IF their business expands and that is when they would start producing chemicals. When discussing what type of business Helena Chemical was and what type of expansion they had in mind, they continuously referred to the Helena location in Geneva. They also mentioned that they would like to build in an area that was not that populated. When I contacted people that live in the surrounding area of the Geneva location I found that on a two mile stretch of road there was only one house and that is about a mile away. After learning this information, I have to question the fact of why Helena thinks it is necessary to build on a two mile stretch of road on Long Bridge that has twenty nine houses populating it. Long Bridge is nowhere near as desolate as Yaegal Road in Geneva New York. I also inquired to the zoning in that area,

and it was properly zoned when they purchased the building from Agway when they closed shop. And with these questions I also inquired into the railway. The railroad in that area is closed off and not usable. There are other areas properly zoned in the Town of Albion that would be useful for what Helena has planned as some of our neighbors will point out.

How can the town vote "Yes" to a Railroad Overlay District that never exist n the comprehensive plan put together in the late 1990's? How can the board vote "Yes" to a plan that was proposed to the town board because a company has interest in a property zoned incorrectly for their plans? We ask that the town board members take a stand and set a precedent to protect the property owner's rights as tax paying citizens and those who elected you into office for the main purpose of protecting our rights. We have faith that you, our elected officials, will vote "NO!' to the zoning change. We hope to see that that by voting "NO" you set a precedent for future businesses coming into town trying to change the current plan to fit their needs.

Helena Chemical can look somewhere else that is properly zoned for their Agricultural business. We are not against their type of business. WE just want them to find a more suitable place to build their business, leave the agricultural farmable land to the farmers and build their business in an area better suited to their needs. Let's stop letting strangers dictate our land layout and in doing so eating up yet more land that takes away from what the area is, AGRICULTURAL-RESIDENTIAL>

OUTLINE OF COMMENTS AT APRIL 11, 2011 PUBLIC HEARINGS

- I. <u>"Protest Letter" pursuant to Town Law 265(1) triggering "Supermajority rule" 4 affirmative votes required to rezone parcel</u>
- II. Town Law Section 263 requirement that rezoning be "in accord" with town's comprehensive plan consideration of character of the district.²
- A. Purpose of the requirement: "to ensure that the amendment is calculated to benefit the entire community, not individual or special interests."
- While a municipality may change its zoning ordinance to promote the general welfare and to respond to changed conditions in the community, the question is whether the change conflicts with the fundamental land use policies and development plans of the community.

Town Law Section 265 Changes. 1. Such regulations, restrictions and boundaries may from time to time be amended. Such amendment shall be effected by a simple majority vote of the town board, except that any such amendment shall require the approval of at least three-fourths of the members of the town board in the event such amendment is the subject of a written protest, presented to the town board and signed by:

⁽a) the owners of twenty percent or more of the area of land included in such proposed change; or

⁽b) the owners of twenty percent or more of the area of land immediately adjacent to that land included in such proposed change, extending one hundred feet therefrom; or

⁽c) the owners of twenty percent or more of the area of land directly opposite thereto, extending one hundred feet from the street frontage of such opposite land.

² NYS § 263. Purposes in view. Such regulations shall be made in accordance with a comprehensive plan and designed to lessen congestion in the streets; to secure safety from fire, flood, panic and other dangers; to promote health and general welfare; to provide adequate light and air; to prevent the overcrowding of land; to avoid undue concentration of population; to make provision for, so far as conditions may permit, the accommodation of solar energy systems and equipment and access to sunlight necessary therefor; to facilitate the practice of forestry; to facilitate the adequate provision of transportation, water, sewerage, schools, parks and other public requirements. Such regulations shall be made with reasonable consideration, among other things, as to the character of the district and its peculiar suitability for particular uses, and with a view to conserving the value of buildings and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout such municipality.

 - Guiding Principles for Development adopted by the town board in 1993: maintain town's rural character; encourage development according to an orderly plan; locate new retail, light industrial and other commercial enterprises in and around the village [p. 1-12]
 - To further goal of "Neighborhood Preservation" [p. 4-5]

Policy: Retain the small town atmosphere and rural character of Barre and Albion. Actions:

- ensure large majority of land is zoned for low density residential/agricultural uses
- encourage more intense land development to occur in targeted areas
- To protect and preserve Agriculture [p. 4-12]

Policy: Encourage farming as the preferred land use in viable agricultural areas.

Actions:

- encourage farmland owners to keep land in open space and agricultural use through creative development designs
- protect established agricultural areas
- General Commercial areas are intended for retail and service businesses that require highway access and a relatively large amount of land [p. 5-4]
 - may include agricultural supply stores
 - location along the west side of Rt. 98, south of village line and north of County House Road, and along Rt. 31 west of village

Town Law § 274-b. Approval of special use permits 1. Definition of special use permit. As used in this section the term "special use permit" shall mean an authorization of a particular land use which is permitted in a zoning ordinance or local law, subject to requirements imposed by such zoning ordinance or local law to assure that the proposed use is in harmony with such zoning ordinance or local law and will not adversely affect the neighborhood if such requirements are met.

Agriculture and Markets Law § 300. <u>Declaration of legislative findings and intent.</u> It is hereby found and declared that many of the agricultural lands in New York state are in jeopardy of being lost for any agricultural purposes. When nonagricultural development extends into farm areas, competition for limited land resources results. Ordinances inhibiting farming tend to follow, farm taxes rise, and hopes for speculative gains discourage investments in farm improvements, often leading to the idling or conversion of potentially productive agricultural land. The socio-economic vitality of agriculture in this state is essential to the economic stability and growth of many local communities and the state as a whole. It is, therefore, the declared policy of the state to conserve, protect and encourage the development and improvement of its agricultural land for production of food and other agricultural products. It is also the declared policy of the state to conserve and protect agricultural lands as valued natural and ecological resources which provide needed open spaces for clean air sheds, as well as for aesthetic purposes. The constitution of the state of New York directs the legislature to provide for the protection of agricultural lands. It is the purpose of this article to provide a locally-initiated mechanism for the protection and enhancement of New York state's agricultural land as a viable segment of the local and state economics and as an economic and environmental resource of major importance.

To All Members of the Albion Town Board:

After all of the problems that the Village of Holley had with Diaz Chemical and the damage that they caused over a ten year period and the problems the people had getting rid of them, I can't even imagine living next door to any kind of chemical business. The Holley homes were contaminated through ground water, through airborne vapors and aerosols.

Those people had to abandon their homes and move from family and friends that many of them had known all of their lives and for several generations. Many suffer with serious health problems and some have died from cancer. Some of the children may have learning disabilities. But of course the causes will never be known. How do you think all of those people felt when they discovered they had been deceived by a chemical company that claimed to be their friend. They were devastated and still are. Not to mention the millions of dollars spent to clean up after them.

I have been accused of being ignorant about Helena Chemical and what they do. I have spent many hours on the computer educating myself about their products and what chemicals make up these products. Chemicals are chemicals no matter how they are packaged. And all can have deadly consequences. I also know for a fact that Helena has paid several fines for air quality and in 2007 they had a fire at their Humboldt, Tenn. Facility. Accidents can happen.

My husband and I have spent the last TEN years working together to make our home one of pride and comfort after moving out of the village because it was so noisy. Suddenly we are faced with the possibility of more noise from tractor trailers and trains and our home being practically worthless on the real estate market. Would you move next door to a chemical company?

I am also a two time Breast Cancer survivor. 2002 and 2005 were the scariest times in my life. Yes, I can still die from cancer but I have worked hard to live this long and I do not want to live in fear every day that I have left because there is a agri-business next door to my home.

It is our responsibility to protect our health and the environment.

That is why I say NO rezoning and NO agri-business. Nothing good can come from this in my opinion. We live in a beautiful rural area. I love waking up in the morning to the singing of hundreds of birds and watching the deer grazing in the fields behind my house and sometimes in my yard. We also have raccoons and fox and other wildlife out here. We love the quiet and privacy that we have now and we were here first.

Please do not let this happen to our little slice of heaven. Say NO to the Rail Road Overlay which ultimately says NO to the rezoning of beautiful farmland and country living.

As a land owner and resident of property on Long Bridge Rd I have many concerns over the the possible rezoning of property on Long Bridge Rd and the proposed site of a chemical company. I am concerned with the negative effect it would have on the neighborhood and surrounding terrain.

My concerns:

- 1. More traffic. It is obvious that this proposed site will be bring more unwelcome traffic in terms of delivery and pick up of goods. The traffic in constructing the building and reshaping the 17 acres could be extensive. The quiet, peaceful neighborhood would become neither. The coming and goings....and of course the stopping of trains at this spot would obviously be disruptive to the residents of the neighborhood. There is a dangerous blind spot between Rt 31 and the railroad track. Often an on coming car is not visually apparent until the last moment. An increase in traffic would increase the risk of an accident there. I ask the board to look into the danger of the blind spot.
- 2. Environmental concerns. Chemicals. Its my understanding that most of the dealings at the proposed site does not deal with chemicals. That is vague to me. 51% can be "most"... leaving 49% chemicals factually accurate. A half mile south and down hill of the proposed site is the Erie Canal and recognized wetlands. I believe all the land south of 31(including the proposed site) is a watershed that feeds the wetlands. Any accident or spillage or even the contruction a facility could have a direct and negative effect on the wetlands and possibly the Erie Canal. Natural wetlands may be put at risk here. I would like input from the DEC on this and other land-use experts that are not hired by the Helena Chemical Company.
- 3. Aesthetics and tourism. Why would we place a massive, visually unappealing, commercial warehouse in the middle of such idyllic and aesthetically pleasing farm land? When giving people tours of our county, scenes of the wide water a half mile down the street and the Culvert tunnel a couple of miles away are highlights. A commercial warehouse with trucks driving in and out and trains stopping is visually disharmonious with its surroundings. Why does this place need to be in the middle of the county in what is now pristine country side?

 I ask the Board to look into the effect this propose site would have on the tourism industry.
- 4. The future. Phrases like "no plans at this time" "no immediate plans" scare the hell out of me. They are meant to minimize what they are asking for. Once zoning is changed there would be little to stop them from making new "immediate plans" and changing their "plans at this time" to something different. If the zoning is changed it will leave the door open to not just expansion of this company but the real possibility of new businesses coming into the same area. Make no mistake... any decision made here will effect the long time future of this area in a profound way. I ask the Board to define limitations or lack of them in terms of future projects. What would changing of the zoning open up to further development? What could this open up?
- 5. Decrease in property value and the negative effect on the quality of life of local land owners. It is very likely the presence of such a business would decrease the value of nearby homes. A status that would only reflect in our attempt to sell our property. I'm sure this decrease in value of our home's status would not be reflected when we pay taxes on the property. Would our taxes be lowered? Probably not...even though our property value may decline. I would like clarification if there is the possibility of our taxes actually going up over said project. Replacing beautiful, quiet farmland with an active, industrial chemical company will certainly have a negative effect in the quality of life of the residents nearby.

Whether, or not, it matters what happens to our neighbors depends on what is happening and whom we consider to be our "neighbors."

Normally we think of the people "next door" as our neighbors. I have described friends living a half mile up the road as "neighbors" though two other families live between us. Another friend two miles away has been called a "neighbor."

Our idea of what matters depends on what we value. Does it matter that an elderly widow living on Social Security has trouble paying her taxes? A woman we pump gas for lost her son in January and her husband in late February. Does that matter? I am certain that those with their faculties would admit it matters to us when a couple of our neighbors get robbed.

Does zoning still matter? What is the purpose of zoning anyway? Not long ago it seemed to matter a great deal to the residents of

Albion. It mattered to decision makers and those who wrote the comprehensive plan as well. Have zoning regulations lost their purpose?

Does it matter that people desirous of some solitude and open space are able to invest in rural property with some expectation that zoning would help protect it and assure their tranquility except for occasional agricultural equipment and trains?

At what point does planned development no 'longer matter? When does the absence of orderly economic development threaten property rights and outweigh good schools, public safety, friendly people and a predominantly rural setting?

Maintaining a semblance of orderly development, consistent with a comprehensive plan and existing zoning, is important to the future of the Town of Albion — but not just Albion. Quality open space and the town's rural character help retain and attract

people. Allowing such quadities to be compromised unnecessarily to accommodate crazy-quilt development makes little sense.

People make decisions about where to live for reasons. Zoning plays an important part in their investment decisions. When the value of one family's private residential property can be significantly diminished for the convenience of a commercial enterprise, no one's property rights are safe. If it can happen to a "neighbor," it can happen to you. And it becomes easier each time it happens again.

Some of this may be inevitable. Often it is avoidable, with alternative sites on land already zoned commercial or light industrial. Protecting our interests often means saying, "No!" For the sake of all of us, the consequences of zoning changes on individual families should be very carefully weighed.
