# AGREEMENT FOR SALE OF SURPLUS WATER

Made this <a href="#">2</a> day of September, 2011 by and between the TOWN OF ALBION, a municipal corporation organized and existing, under the laws of the State of New York having its principal place of business at 3665 Clarendon Road, Albion, New York and the TOWN OF ALBION WATER DISTRICTS, and any future districts approved by Town Council for the TOWN OF ALBION, hereinafter jointly referred to as "ALBION" and the TOWN OF BARRE, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York having its principal place of business at 14317 West Barre Road, Albion, New York hereinafter referred to as "BARRE";

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, ALBION represents that it has established Water District No. 9 and that said extension was established in full compliance with the laws of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, ALBION has constructed and now operates water distribution systems to provide, supply and deliver water to certain residents of the Town of Albion; and

WHEREAS, but for Water District No. 1, BARRE supplies by way of surplus water, water to the remaining water districts established and constructed by ALBION; and

WHEREAS, Water District No. 9 has yet to be constructed but ALBION will be requesting that BARRE supply the water needed for this district, at a daily average flow rate of 3780 gallons per day; and

WHEREAS, ALBION and BARRE wish to enter into a ten (10) year contract for the sale of surplus water from BARRE to ALBION with the understanding that BARRE will continue to supply surplus water to ALBION for a minimum of thirty eight (38) years upon terms to be negotiated by the parties in the future; and

WHEREAS, the parties herein wish to formalize by way of this written agreement to insure the continued availability of water to ALBION and to ensure the usage and demand for water to BARRE for the period of this contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

**Section 1**: ALBION shall own, manage, operate and maintain, at its sole expense said water distribution system. ALBION shall enact and enforce the provisions of the New York State laws and sanitary code that prohibit cross connections and that requires devices to prevent backflow into municipal water systems as described herein.

**Section 2:** Extensions, expansions or repairs to ALBION'S distribution system shall only be made with the approval of BARRE and subject to the following requirements:

- A. <u>WATER VAULT</u>: in accordance with plans and specifications provided by BARRE, which makes no representations or warranties and assumes no obligation or liabilities by the providing of such plans and specifications at a point satisfactory to BARRE.
- B. <u>WATER MAINS AND DISTRIBUTION LINES</u> as may be required by BARRE from a point satisfactory to it, ALBION shall obtain, in connection therewith, at its sole expense all necessary rights of way and/or easements, and all permits or licenses required by the laws or regulations of the United States of America, the State of New York or any political subdivision thereof. ALBION shall at its sole expense, in a manner approved by BARRE, its employees or agents, make the necessary connection with the BARRE line if necessary and shall give BARRE at least twenty-four (24) hours notice of the actual tapping and connecting with the said supply line which operations shall be done only at a time satisfactory to BARRE. ALBION shall not pay any BARRE permit or other fees for such connection.

ALBION shall make connection for Water District No. 9A, 9B, and 9C to previously established water districts in the Town of Albion. Water District No. 9A shall connect to Water District No. 5 near the intersection of Telegraph Road (New York State Route 31) and Allens Bridge Road. Water District No. 9B shall connect to Water District No. 1 near the intersection of Telegraph Road (New York State Route 31) and Keitel Road. Water District No. 9C shall connect to Water District No. 4 near the intersection of East Lee Road (New York State Route 31) and Power Line Road. No new taps will be made to any pre-existing lines of BARRE.

ALBION shall take all steps necessary to prevent foreign matter from entering said existing lines. ALBION shall reimburse BARRE for any expense incurred by BARRE in removing such foreign matter from said line and/or the disinfecting of said line or any part thereof and for any work required by any governmental authority.

C. Additional pumps and/or treatment facilities shall be installed in ALBION'S distribution system if required for compliance with any governmental requirements or for proper installation of the distribution system as deemed necessary by engineers retained by BARRE.

Section 3: BARRE shall deliver such water as ALBION from time to time requires. Water so furnished shall meet with all requirements of the State of New York Department of Health for potable water. However the failure of water so furnished to meet such requirements of said Department shall not relieve ALBION from payment at rates set forth herein for water delivered to ALBION as able as set forth.

Provided, however, in the event of acts of God or other emergencies or emergency uses, or for other reasons beyond control of BARRE, it is unable to provide water to ALBION, BARRE shall not be liable for any damages or injuries resulting from such failure

to ALBION of third parties, and such failure shall not be considered a breach of this agreement.

**Section 4:** It is understood that BARRE has not been provided with copies of the plan for the future distribution of water within the Town of Albion or plans and specifications for the construction of future distribution lines, for future water districts. Therefore, no water shall be delivered to the Town of Albion until such time as a complete set of accurate plans and specifications for the future districts are provided to and approved by BARRE. Any sale by ALBION in violation of this provision may void this agreement at the option of BARRE.

**Section 5:** The duly authorized representatives or the BARRE staff has the right to enter on land of ALBION or of others to inspect water lines constructed by ALBION together with the meter and appurtenances of the water system. BARRE shall recommend to ALBION any changes in operating or maintenance procedures with respect to such lines as, in the opinion of BARRE are required to conform to best water supply practice. ALBION shall comply as soon as reasonably practical with all such requests of BARRE.

**Section 6:** BARRE shall furnish employees to make quarterly readings of ALBION'S bulk water meter installed pursuant to Section 1, but not the meters metering usage by consumers of water provided by ALBION.

Section 7: ALBION shall pay to BARRE for water delivered to the lines serving ALBION and passing through the bulk meter an initial rate of \$2.86 per 1000 gallons of water. BARRE warrants that the rate is the same to other bulk users (TOWNS) outside BARRE'S corporate limits. ALBION will have the right to be heard and opportunity to review the basis or justification of any rate increase and/or decrease with notification by BARRE to ALBION in writing three (3) months prior to said rate change. Any future increase and/or decrease will be the same to all bulk users (TOWNS).

**Section 8:** ALBION shall pay to BARRE for water delivered to the lines serving ALBION and passing through the bulk meter, at a rate to be determined as follows: Rate to be determined by the BARRE, to be applicable to bulk users outside of the corporate limits of BARRE, said rates to be set by the BARRE with recognition of ALBION'S right to be heard and opportunity to review the basis or justification of any rate increase and/or to said rates.

**Section 9:** In addition to the above agreed rates for water, ALBION agrees to reimburse BARRE for all costs and disbursements required to obtain necessary permits, consents, approval or other procedures from New York State Water Resources Commission or other governmental agencies as billed to ALBION by BARRE.

**Section 10:** This agreement is conditioned upon the obtaining of all necessary permits, consents or approvals or any governmental agencies by BARRE or ALBION including, but not limited, to, the New York State Water Resources Commission, the Attorney General of the State of New York, and the Comptroller of the State of New York.

Failure to obtain any such necessary permits, consents or approvals, through no fault of the parties hereto shall void this agreement and to cooperate in such applications and other procedures in connection therewith.

- Section 11: In any emergency situation, when requested by ALBION, BARRE agrees, if reasonably possible to assign its employees regularly utilized in the repair and maintenance of its water line within BARRE, to assist in the repair and maintenance of ALBION'S water system, such as: Ascertaining the location of leaks; plugging and repairing leaks; shutting and opening valves; tapping the waterline; removing and repairing valves and any other work on the water line normally requiring the service of workmen with specialized knowledge of water lines. ALBION shall assign such labor and equipment as may be required at the request of BARRE for such work by BARRE, ALBION shall compensate BARRE as follows:
- (a) For labor furnished, the amounts actually paid by BARRE, including fringe benefits to its employees while engaged in such requires and maintenance, plus 10%.
- (b) For equipment furnished, State contract rates in effect at the time such work is performed, plus 10%.
- **Section 12:** In the event of a break in the water main or other trouble within ALBION'S water system, BARRE may temporarily shut off the delivery of water to ALBION if in the opinion of BARRE such action is necessary to protect the overall production, transmission or distribution of water by BARRE until such trouble is corrected.
- **Section 13:** This agreement shall be in effect from the date of execution of this document and for a term of ten (10) years from the date of September \_\_, 2011 to September \_\_, 2021 and may be extended for a total of thirty eight (38) years and upon such terms and conditions as the parties hereto may agree. If this Agreement be terminated by reason of failure of either party to agreed term as herein provided, or for any other reason, then, in the event ALBION shall sever and disconnect its pipe line from the pipe line or lines of BARRE without any resulting claim whatsoever in favor of BARRE for damage. Provided, that ALBION shall be responsible and liable for restoring BARRE'S supply line to a condition which will allow BARRE to transmit water without leakage and shall be liable for any resulting damage to transmission line.
- **Section 14:** The provision of this Agreement shall be binding upon and insure to the benefit of the respective parties hereto and their successors and assigns.
- **Section 15**: This Agreement shall be terminated prior to the expiration date hereof, or any extension thereof as follows:
  - 1. Upon written mutual agreement executed by the parties hereto.

- 2. Failure of ALBION or BARRE to comply with any of the terms herein, and the declaration of a breach by BARRE or ALBION. Notice of breaches shall be given in writing. The breaching party shall have ten (10) days to cure upon notice of the breach.
- 3. Failure of ALBION to remit payments required under this Agreement within ninety (90) days of the date of the billing therefore, and the declaration of a breach by BARRE.
- 4. Failure of ALBION to provide BARRE with certified copies of any resolution or other documents or information requested by BARRE, including, but not limited to, resolutions authorizing the execution of this contract and documents establishing the Town of Albion Water Districts, and the declaration of a breach by BARRE.
- 5. ALBION may terminate the Agreement upon ninety (90) days notice if BARRE raises the rate charged ALBION for water for the rate at the time of executing this Agreement.

# Joint Municipal Agreement between the Town of Barre and Town of Albion

THIS AGREEMENT, made the 12 day of September, 2011 between the Town of Barre and the Town of Albion,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the parties to address and clarify items concerning the sharing of operation, maintenance and administrative costs associated with operating common elements of the water system which provides potable drinking water to each community for consumption and fire fighting purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is to the mutual benefit of each community to resolve issues of common expense, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Albion has established Water Districts 1 through 8,

WHEREAS, the Town of Barre has established Water Districts 1 through 4,

WHEREAS, there are items of common expense for the maintenance, preservation and continued operation of the waterlines, the expense of which are of equal benefit to the parties, and

WHEREAS, there are present items of expense which the parties agree should be subject to apportionment, based upon the relative use of said items by the respective water districts, and

WHEREAS, there are certain Items of expense which are the responsibility of the Village of Albion, as relates to the Chlorination System as Booster Pump Station #2, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Barre Agrees that it is solely responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the distribution lines between the Booster Pump Station #2 and the 150,000-gallon Storage Tank, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Albion agrees that it is solely responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the Master Meter located at Route 31A and Route 98, and

WHEREAS, each Town acknowledges that it is responsible for the actual water consumed within its water districts, irrespective of common expense items, and

WHEREAS, each Town Board has authorized by resolution the Terms of this Agreement to provide for municipal responsibility of payments between the Towns relating to common an Individual costs incurred by each respective water district with their Town.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, it is hereby agreed:

- 1. Each Town shall be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of items which are their sole responsibility without contribution.
- 2. The cost for items of common expense, except as herein noted, which are generally not related to the relative usage of water shall be split equally between the municipalities and their respective water districts. The common items relate to the Booster Pump Station #2 and the 150,000-gallon storage tank, and consist of preventative maintenance.

The cost to the Town of Albion for its share of security and periodic inspections, insurance, telephone charges, utility charges at the storage tank and general administration shall be charged to the Town of Albion at the rate of 15 cents per thousand gallons of water delivered to the Town of Albion.

All other costs for expenses which are related to actual usage of water, included but not limited to system repairs, shall be allocated between the municipalities based on their prorate share of usage. Allocation of such common expenses shall be adjusted with each billing period.

- 3. The Town of Albion shall reimburse the Town of Barre on a quarterly basis for the cost of water based upon the actual gallons of water used at the current water rate charged at the time by the Village of Albion. The Town of Barre shall read the Master Meter at Booster Pump Station #2 as well as the Master Meter at Routes 31A and 98 and shall calculate the water usage for each community.
- 4. The Town of Albion shall relmburse the Town of Barre on a quarterly basis for the common costs as described above based on the agreed percentages. The Town of Barre shall provide documentation and data to support each invoice submitted to the Town of Albion.
- 5. In the event that the geographic boundaries of the water districts change, or additional water districts shall be created by either town which derive services from the water system as currently constituted, then the parties agree to review and discuss modifications to this agreement based up the changes resulting in the service area.
- 6. The parties agree that they shall first attempt to negotiate any disagreements amicably. In the event that the parties are unable to reach agreement through negotiation, the parties agree to submit said dispute to binding arbitration. The arbitration panel shall be selected y each Town picking a panel member, and the tow panel member selecting the third arbitrator, who shall be the chairperson of the arbitration panel. Any arbitration occurring shall be in accordance with the rules developed by the American Arbitration Association, Construction Industry Standards, but shall not occur under the auspices of the AAA. Expense of arbitration shall be divided equally between the parties.

- 7. This agreement shall be in effect fro the date of execution of this document and for a term of 5 years, 2011 to 2016. The Agreement shall automatically renew for successive one-year periods unless either party gives notice to the other, in writing, of its intent not to extend its term, such notice to be given at least 180 days prior to the expiration of the initial term or any extensions thereof. Any such notice must be based on good cause shown which means a material breach of the agreement by the other party.
- 8. In the event that the operation and maintenance of the Town of Barre water system is taken over by another municipality during the term of this agreement, or any extensions thereof, this agreement shall terminate provided that the Towns of Barre and Albion shall both execute an agreement acknowledging the effective takeover by such other municipality.
- Annexed hereto and made a part of the agreement are duly certified copies of the resolution of each Town Board authorizing execution of this joint municipal agreement.

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### JOINT SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR APPRAISAL SERVICES, EXEMPTION SERVICES AND ASSESSMENT SERVICES BY THE COUNTY OF ORLEANS

THIS AGREEMENT made as of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2011, by and between the County of Orleans, organized and existing pursuant to the County Law of the State of New York, with offices at Courthouse Square, Albion, New York, (hereinafter the "County"), the Town of Albion, a municipal corporation organized and existing pursuant to the Town Law of the State of New York, with offices at 3665 Clarendon Road, Albion, New York, (hereinafter "Albion") and the Town of Gaines, a municipal corporation organized and existing pursuant to the Town Law of the State of New York, with offices at 14087 Ridge Road, Albion, New York (hereinafter "Gaines"), (collectively, the "Parties"),

WHEREAS, the County, Albion and Gaines are empowered to enter into a joint services agreement whereby the County will provide appraisal services, exemption services and assessment services to Albion and Gaines pursuant to section 1537 of the Real Property Tax Law and Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law; and

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Joint Services Agreement for Appraisal Services, Exemption Services and Assessment Services By the County of Orleans (hereinafter "Joint Services Agreement") made as of the 13th day of December, 2006, as authorized by County resolution number 526-1206, and

WHEREAS, the term of the said Joint Services Agreement terminates on September 30, 2011, and

WHEREAS, the Parties are desirous of continuing the existing Joint Services Agreement for an additional five year term effective October 1, 2011 and terminating on September 30, 2016 on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of this Agreement have been approved by a majority vote of the Town Board of each Town and the County Legislature of the County;

The parties hereto agree as follows:

- (1)(a) The County shall appraise all real property within the Towns of Albion and Gaines for assessment purposes.
  - (b) The County shall employ appraisers and other technical personnel to make the appraisals of such properties. No person shall be employed by the County and assigned professional appraisal duties, which relate to the assessment of real property for purposes of taxation unless such person meets the minimum qualification standards established by the New York

- (4) The reasonable costs of the County in performing its obligations in accordance with this Agreement shall be billed to Gaines and Albion. Such costs shall be reviewed in July each year by the County and by the Town Boards of Gaines and Albion during the term of this Agreement. If any party hereto desires to make any amendments and modifications to the terms and provisions of this Agreement, a joint session of the parties or their designated representatives shall be held no later than the third Wednesday in July at a mutually agreeable date and time to discuss the proposed amendments and modifications. The minutes of such joint session shall become part of this Agreement.
- (5) The Chief Budget Officer of the County shall determine on or before August 15 of every year of this Agreement each Town's share of the costs and expenses under this Agreement. The County shall render quarterly statements to Gaines and Albion for the amounts due hereunder during the next fiscal year, which quarterly amounts Albion and Gaines hereby agree to pay to the County no later than forty-five days from the date the quarterly statements are rendered.
- (6) This Agreement shall be amended or modified only upon approval by a majority vote of the Town Board of each Town and the County Legislature of the County, except that there shall be no right of termination by any party prior to October 1 of any year.

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- (7) Upon the expiration of the term of the appointed assessor, or in the event the appointed assessor resigns or is otherwise unable to remain in office, the parties agree that a single individual shall be appointed within 60 days of such expiration, resignation, or removal.
- As provided under the existing Joint Services Agreement made as of the 13<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2006, pursuant to the provisions of section 3.(b) of Real Property Tax Law §579, all real property shall continue to be assessed at the same uniform percentage of value in all of the assessing units participating in the coordinated assessment program throughout the term of the agreement. In addition, such percentage of value shall be annually printed on the tentative assessment rolls for the participating assessing units.
- (9) A copy of this Agreement shall be filed with the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance and the State Office of Real Property Tax Services on or before the taxable status date of the first assessment roll to which it is to apply.
- (10) The parties hereto shall mutually agree upon a person, other than the County Director of Real Property Tax Services to perform assessment

services in accordance with this Agreement. Such person shall be approved by a majority vote of each of the parties' respective governing bodies. Such person shall be deemed the assessor or each assessing unit and shall be subject to all provisions of law pertaining to assessors.

TOWN OF GAINES

(11) This Agreement which continues the existing Joint Services Agreement shall take effect as of October 1, 2011 and shall terminate on September 30, 2016 or until a party withdraws from the Agreement.
