RESOLUTION #53 TO HOLD A JOINT MEETING PROPOSING A JOINT FIRE DISTRICT

WHEREAS Town Law § 189-a authorizes the town boards of more than one town, and the board of trustees of an incorporated village, located in said town or towns, to establish in such towns and in such village a joint fire district in the manner provided in such statute for the purposes and in the manner, therein stated provided that all of the territory in such joint fire district shall be continuous, and not within the limits of a city; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Albion, the Town of Albion and the Town of Gaines, Orleans County, New York, have formed a committee to discuss, prepare and determine the possibility of the establishment of a Joint Fire District, encompassing the Village of Albion, the Town of Gaines and the Town of Albion which area encompasses the Albion and Gaines Fire Protection District. The joint fire district is to be called the Albion Joint Fire District. Said

committee having met on numerous occasions to discuss and prepare the proposal for the establishment of the fire district and has shared the proposal with the members of the respective boards; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Albion having determined it to be in the public interest of the citizens of the Town of Albion, which includes the geographic areas of the Albion Fire Protection District, to participate in a joint meeting with Town Board of Albion, the Town Board of Gaines and the Village Board of the Village of Albion to consider the proposal regarding the establishment of a joint fire district, to be called the Albion Joint Fire District, (Joint Fire District or Fire District) and

WHEREAS said Boards are in favor of holding a joint public meeting at one location within the proposed joint fire district for the purpose of jointly proposing the establishment of such a joint fire district, the object and purposes for which it is proposed to create the new district is to provide fire protection in such district; and

WHEREAS, the boundaries of such joint fire district, which are contiguous and not within the limits of a city encompasses the entire Village of Albion and the Towns of Albion and Town of Gaines (participating municipalities) all located within the County of Orleans, State of New York. the object and purposes for which it is proposed that a new fire district be created is to provide fire protection within the areas of the proposed Albion Joint Fire District, and

WHEREAS at separate meetings held on January 8th, 2024 the Town Boards of Albion and Gaines and on January 10, 2024, the Village Board of Albion designated the Town Board of the Town of Albion as lead agency for the purposes of environmental review pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) regarding the establishment of the joint fire district, and

WHEREAS such joint meeting shall be open to the public, and held at the Gaines Town Hall, 14087 Ridge Road West, Albion, New York 14411 at 6:00 P.M. on March 27, 2024. The Gaines Town Hall is located in the Town of Gaines, Orleans County, New York; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by an affirmative vote of a majority of the voting strength of the Albion Town Board that a meeting be held jointly with of the Town Board of the Town of Gaines, the Town Board of the Town of Town of Albion and the Village Board of the Village of Albion at shall be held at 6:00 on March 27, 2024, at the Gaines Town Hall,14087 Ridge Road West, Albion, New York 14411, this location being within the boundaries of the proposed joint fire district as follows:

Resolution #55 GRANTING CONDITIONAL APPROVAL WEST ALBION COMMUNITY SOLAR PROJECT 12795 NYS ROUTE 31

WHEREAS the Town of Albion Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as "Planning Board"), is considering a Special Use Permit and Site Plan approval for the construction of a 2.25 megawatt (MW) alternating current (AC) solar photovoltaic facility occupying approximately ±15.7 acres of ±60.86 acre parcel located on Tax Number 71.-1-61.1, located at 12795 NYS Route 31 in the Town of Albion, Orleans County, New York, and as described in the Site Plans dated May 25, 2023, last revised September 14, 2023 and all other relevant information submitted, and

WHEREAS the property owner by and through NY USLE ALBION LONG BRIDGE LLC (hereinafter referred to as the "Project Company") having submitted, among other things, a Site Plan, an Operations and Maintenance Plan and a Decommissioning Plan all in furtherance of the Site Plan and Special Use Permit approval applications currently pending before the Planning Board, and

WHEREAS on January 3, 2024 the Albion Town Planning Board having granted conditional approval to the application subject to this Board's Resolution approving the Decommissioning Plan financial security, and NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. The Board does hereby approve the proposed Decommissioning Plan and financial security from the Project Company in the form of a Surety Bond conditioned and contingent upon:

- a) The financial security is to be provided by the Project Company to the Town of Albion in the amount of Two Hundred Seventy Six Thousand Five Hundred Forty Six Dollars and Seventy Five Cents (\$276,546.75), same to be provided by the Project Company to the Town of Albion in the form of a Surety Bond prior to issuance of any Certificate of Completion.
- b) Deliver to the Town of Albion, through Albion Town Attorney James D, Bell, of the original Surety Bond executed by the applicant and insurance company.
 - c) Final approval by the Albion Town Planning Board of said application.

WHEREAS, the Town of Albion (hereinafter "local government") believes that climate change poses a real and increasing threat to our local and global environments and is primarily due to the burning of fossil fuels; and

WHEREAS, the effects of climate change will endanger our infrastructure, economy and livelihoods; harm our farms, orchards, and ecological communities, including native fish and wildlife populations; spread invasive species and exotic diseases; reduce drinking water supplies and recreational opportunities; and pose health threats to our citizens; and

WHEREAS, we believe that our response to climate change provides us with an unprecedented opportunity to save money, and to build livable, energy-independent and secure communities, vibrant innovation economies, healthy and safe schools, and resilient infrastructures; and

WHEREAS, we believe the scale of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reductions required for climate stabilization will require sustained and substantial efforts; and

WHEREAS, we believe that even if emissions were dramatically reduced today, communities would still be required to adapt to the effects of climate change for decades to come,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that Town Albion of in order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to a changing climate, adopts the New York State Climate Smart Communities pledge, which comprises the following ten elements:

Town of Albion Earns Clean Energy Communities Designation, \$5,000 Grant

The Town of Albion recently earned recognition as a Designated Clean Energy Community through the New York State Energy Research & Development Authority's (NYSERDA) Clean Energy Communities (CEC) Program. In doing so, the Town also earned a \$5,000 grant to assist with future Clean Energy Initiatives.

To earn designation, the Town needed to complete four (4) of the High Impact Actions included in the CEC Program. They chose to complete an LED Streetlight Conversion, adopt Benchmarking, adopt the Unified Solar Permit, and attended Code Enforcement Training in the current Leadership Round.

By replacing conventional streetlights with energy efficient LED technology, communities can reduce street light energy use by 74%, generating significant cost savings and emission reductions. Because street light electricity is typically a municipal expense, the opportunity to cut costs in the municipal budget is large. LED streetlights last much longer and require much less maintenance than conventional streetlights. They can incorporate smart, connected technologies, such as dimming functions, and parking management.

The Town plans to use their \$5,000 Designation Grant towards future clean energy and sustainability projects and initiatives.
